Fabric Deodorizer

Stinky clothes, sheets, furniture, or towels you don't have time to wash? Skip the store-bought sprays (they're toxic) and try this. Bonus! This recipe also works great as an ant deterrent and bug spray. Just don't use this on granite, stone, or houseplants because the vinegar can cause damage.

Yields approximately 1 cup

1 cup white vinegar

5 drops essential oils (We like lemon, rosemary, lemongrass, or lavender. If you like a stronger scent, add more drops.)

Optional: Instead of essential oils, you can infuse vinegar with citrus peels and herbs. Add as many as you like, depending on your scent preferences.

To use as a spray:

- Pour vinegar into a new mister or spray bottle.
- 2. Add essential oils, herbs, or peels. Note: If you are using peels or herbs, fill a glass quart jar halfway with peels and/or herbs. Pour vinegar into jar and let steep for 8–10 days. Then strain out peels or herbs and pour into bottle.
- 3. Shake well and spray.

To use as a room deodorizer:

Fill bowl with white vinegar and essential oils or infused vinegar. Place bowl in the room that needs freshening.



Use New Bottles: Never pour vinegar into a used or old cleaning bottle because trace amounts of the cleaner may be left behind in the plastic, and that may create harmful vapors. Always use a new bottle.
